
If students to ride to school, then we have a sheltered bike shed and excellent transport links for public transport users. For further information, our FAQ can be found here:



It is very beneficial to your children and to the academy that you apply for these as additional funding is available to the school to enhance the all-round provision and opportunities. Your child may receive free school meals if you get any of the following benefits:

- income support
- income-based jobseekers allowance
- income-related employment and support allowance
- support under immigration and asylum law
- the guarantee part of state pension credit
- child tax credit and you have an annual income of £16,190 before tax or less (whatever Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs works out for you).

But you will need to apply for them. Make sure you have your National Insurance number to hand before you fill in the form.
